

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

WEEK 1: BASKETBALL TECHNICAL CLINIC

At our basketball clinic, players will focus on mastering the fundamentals that build a strong foundation for success. Athletes will work on ball-handling, shooting form, passing accuracy, and footwork through engaging drills and small-sided games. They'll also learn key concepts like spacing, communication, and court awareness to develop a higher basketball IQ and a strong team-first mindset.

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PAYMENT POLICY

A one-time, \$85 non-refundable registration fee, plus a \$45 non-refundable deposit per session is required at registration. The balance of fees for summer programs will be automatically withdrawn on May 1 from the credit card on file. Receive a 10% discount off total camp tuition when registered by February 20.

REFUND/CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellation requests must be received at least 2-weeks prior to the start date of the camp. No refunds will be given for cancellations within 2 weeks of a camp starting. Refunds will not include the \$45 deposit or the \$85 registration fee. Variations from this cancellation policy will be noted in camp descriptions. In the event the school must cancel a camp, every effort will be made to find a replacement class for the camper. If the school must refund due to cancellation of a camp, the refund may include all fees, including deposit and registration.

SIBLING DISCOUNT

10% sibling discount (applied to second and subsequent children only, and not applicable for Early/Late Bird).

REFERRAL DISCOUNT

\$50 camp tuition credit to the referring family for each camper referred. Referred camper must list referring family name when registering in ACTIVE. Credit may only be used in ACTIVE; no check or cash bonuses.

LUNCH

Campers should bring their lunch daily. Lunch will not be provided or available for purchase at camp.

WATER BOTTLES

Campers should bring their own water bottle to camp. Water refill stations are available.

T-SHIRT

Each camper receives one t-shirt with camp registration (sizes 2T – Adult 3XL).

SUNSCREEN/INSECT REPELLENT

Sunscreen and/or insect repellent should be applied prior to coming to camp. If your camper requires reapplication of the product while at camp, an authorization form must be submitted to the Health Office. Campers are required to bring their own sunscreen and/or insect repellent.

DEPOSITS

A \$100 non-refundable deposit is required for each course. Deposit amounts will be deducted from the program fees. Please see Program/Course Changes below for our one-time complimentary deposit transfer policy.

TUITION FEES AND BALANCES

Tuition fees are as listed and on our website. The balance of fees for summer programs will be automatically withdrawn on May 1 from the credit card on file.

MULTI COURSE DISCOUNT

Receive \$50 discount when you register for 2 courses per student; \$75 discount when you register for 3 courses per student; \$100 discount when you register for 4 or more courses per student.

All courses need to be purchased in one transaction to be eligible for the discounts.

If courses are purchased in separate transactions, email the Summer Team at sv.summer@basisindependent.com for a coupon code to apply at checkout when registering for additional course(s).

REFERRAL DISCOUNT

\$50 summer tuition credit to the referring family for each student referred. Referred student must list referring family name when registering in ACTIVE. Credit may only be used in ACTIVE; no check or cash bonuses.

PROGRAM/COURSE CHANGES

There will be one complimentary program/course change allowed by April 24. During this complimentary change, your initial \$100 deposit will be transferred to the new program/course without any additional charge.

Any additional changes made by April 24 will incur a \$25 charge to each transaction. No changes are permitted after April 24.

LATE PICK-UP FEE

Late Pick-Up fee will be charged at the time of pick up if student is not picked up within 10 minutes after the conclusion of the program. Starting 10 minutes after scheduled end time of the program, a \$25 fee plus \$1 for each additional minute will be charged.

REFUND POLICY

Until April 24:

Refunds are permitted, minus the \$100 non-refundable deposit.

After April 24:

In the event that a course is canceled due to low enrollment, the full amount (including the non-refundable deposit), minus a \$25 processing fee, will be refunded. There will also be no tuition refunds or tuition transfers for any reason other than course cancellation. Deposits and program fees are non-refundable under any and all circumstances and cannot be transferred to another session or another student. This includes, but is not limited to, absence(s), withdrawal before the end of the program, and disruptive behavior or other misconduct.

IMPORTANT DATES

- January 12: Registration opens.
- April 24: Cancellations and refunds permitted, minus the \$100 non-refundable deposit.
- May 1: Registration closes and the balance of fees for summer programs will be automatically withdrawn on May 1 from the credit card on file.
- After May 1, Registration remains open only if there are remaining spaces. Full payment required for all registrations on or after this date. Wait-lists available for programs with full capacity.

ATTENDANCE POLICY FOR FOR-CREDIT ACADEMIC COURSES

- Students must inform the teacher in advance before missing any class.
- Students may miss no more than 5 days if enrolled in any for-credit course, with the exception of Economics, in which students may miss no more than 3 days.
- If you have not been approved by your school to be eligible to register for a math level, you will not be issued a refund.

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For-Credit Courses FAQ



Some answers might be slightly different depending on the situation or student.

QUESTIONS ABOUT REGISTRATION AND ELIGIBILITY

Q: When is the last date to register for summer courses? In addition, are there different dates for different courses?

A: The last day to register is the Thursday before the first date of the summer course you are planning on taking. Courses may fill up prior to that date so we recommend signing up early to reserve space. The majority of our for-credit courses run for the entirety of the five week session, however we also have enrichment programs that are scheduled for one and two weeks. All course schedules are varied based on the subject matter and general requirements of each course.

Q: If I change my mind about a summer course and want to cancel enrollment can I get a refund?

A: Refunds will be given prior to April 25 in certain circumstances, and minus the \$80 deposit. Refunds may be given if a parent purchased a duplicate course by accident, but not if a for-credit course was purchased for a student who has not met the eligibility requirements for the course. Please note that after April 25, refunds will not be issued for those instances in which a child wishes to cancel their registration.

Q: I saw a summer course that I wanted to sign my child up for but now it is not available online. Is the course full?

A: As we get closer to the end of May, we will cancel those courses that have not met the minimum enrollment number. However, sometimes searching in ACTIVE does not yield the results that it should, so please let us know what course you are looking for and we can confirm.

Q: I am registering my child for the Algebra 2/Geometry for-credit course. I noticed that there's a disclaimer "I understand as a BASIS Independent student that I am required to receive Dean approval prior to registering for any for-credit math courses. I also understand that if I choose to register without approval, and my child subsequently is not approved for the course, the deposit and tuition paid are not refundable." Should we get Dean approval before registering?

A: Yes, while BASIS Independent students may wish to accelerate their math pathway, they must do this with approval. During T2, current students who are in Algebra 2/Geometry and below will be informed if they have a high enough average in their current math class to be eligible to sign up for summer math acceleration (if they wish to). Newly admitted students must also meet eligibility requirements to accelerate their math course. Any child who enrolled in a for-credit course that they are not eligible for will not be refunded for the course.

Q: My child is currently taking Algebra 1/Geometry. Can they take Algebra 2/Geometry this summer for credit?

A: During T2, families will receive an email letting them know if their child is eligible to move on to the next math level. If you have not received this information by March, please check with your child's Dean.

Q: My child has self-studied for math over the last several years and knows higher-level math than the summer course. Please tell me why they cannot test out of the math level and accelerate that way?

A: Your student will need to take their next math class in sequence over the summer so that this course is listed on their academic transcript. We have to strictly follow our course sequencing so that all graduation requirements for specific math levels are listed per the state of California requirements. We have many students who opt to self-study in a variety of subjects, but we still have to follow the transcript and have them enrolled in the next course in sequence irrespective of any outside knowledge that students may learn in various enrichment environments. They may find the course easy this summer, but they can definitely use that to their advantage, as it is an accelerated course with a short time span.

Q: Is there an option to enroll in enrichment programs for only certain days, with the fees prorated accordingly?

A: We will not be able to prorate the cost, but you are welcome to enroll a student in an enrichment course even if they do not plan to attend all dates.

QUESTIONS ABOUT ATTENDANCE

Q: Is my child required to take the entire 120 hours of course material, or can they just take the final assessment?

A: In order to get the full academic credit, your child will need to participate in the course and attend all but five days. Missing more time than this will mean that your child does not earn credit for the course.

Q: We have plans for travel during the first week of class; will you be able to share recordings of the lessons that my student will miss? Can they self-study to stay on track and make up work when they return?

A: All of our courses are live, high engagement courses, whether offered in-person or virtually. Curriculum is taught during the classes themselves, and we do not offer resources to self-study, as the intention of the course is that it is an instructor led class. Specific to our absence policy however, students are required to attend the first and last weeks of for-credit courses. These weeks are simply too important to the course with respect to the foundational knowledge and procedures.

Q: My child has qualified for a competition and will be missing some days of the summer course. How should we handle this?

A: That is a very exciting prospect! Please keep in mind that students may miss no more than five days if enrolled in any for-credit course, with the exception of Economics, in which students may miss no more than three days. Please alert the Summer HOS about your planned travel dates to see if taking the course this summer is advisable based on the time your student will be missing. Please note that students may not miss any dates during the first and last weeks of any for-credit summer course.

QUESTIONS ABOUT THE START OF THE COURSE AND GRADING

Q: We've registered for an in-person course. Will we be able to order lunch online like during the regular school year?

A: Unfortunately, we do not provide lunch during the summer. Students should bring snacks and/or lunch each day.

Q: When will I receive my Schoology login to be able to access content for my summer course?

A: The logins will be shared approximately a week prior to the first date of your summer course. These credentials will be sent to the email address that parents used to register their student for our summer program.

Q: The course my child signed up for has an eBook set as the textbook. When will I find out how to access the text?

A: Within a week of the start of the course, you will receive an email with Zoom login information for your child's course. More details will be shared during the first class meeting.

Q: What are the grading policies for summer programs; how do I know if my child passed on to the next math level?

A: To move on to the next math level in the fall, students need to earn both a 90% on the final exam and a 90% grade in the course. If it ends up being the case that your student does not earn a 90% or better for the final grade, we would have your student repeat their summer course in the fall.

Q: After the final exam, how soon will we know if our student passed their math course?

A: The final is held on the last day of the course, and all final grades are submitted that same day. Final grades for summer courses can be expected in a week to 10 days following the end of the course. Based on the results, math levels are then scheduled for the coming school year.
